## **Emergency Plans**

(what actions will be taken if an incident occurs)

Secure scene, check all students safe.

Check person/s involved

Phone emergency service if required

Inform Lead Instructor

Lead Instructor to contact & inform Principal/Teacher & Manager

Lead Instructor to arrange other students safe return or to join other groups & organise bike/helmet of person/s involved Instructor/s to fill in any required incident reporting forms (red book for minor incidents and more detailed documentation to be reported to Lead instructors whereupon the relevant online incident forms will be completed).

## Additional Information

On-road ratios of adults to students will be at least 1:6, with a maximum allowed group size 2 adults and 12 students. The On-Site Lead will have discretion on the maximum appropriate for each session, however it cannot exceed this. If there are more than six students and only one instructor is fully signed-off (as per above criteria) then the maximum allowed group number is 2 adults and 10 students

If children do not meet the required Grade 1 standards prior to on-road sessions they will not be permitted to participate in on road sessions. If capacity allows, children that are identified as being able to participate on-road but needing more basic training will be offered a simplified on-road course, in agreement with the school.

Instructors to report any new hazard or incidents using appropriate forms stored in vehicles or accessed on the intranet.

Note: Teacher aide may be required for students with specific needs

All children are to receive a certificate advising of the competencies achieved with a recommendation as to whether further adult supervision is recommended in light traffic conditions.

Cycle Safe will liaise with school on any further risk mitigation, should delivery be at a time when COVID 19 alert levels demand more controls such as heighted cleaning or maximising social distancing.
